

A miniature children's atlas by Louise Romanna von Reiche was issued in 1831. It was produced by the lithographer Kaufmann Johann Gottfried Tiedemann at Bützow, a town in the district of Rostock in Germany. This was possibly the smallest atlas of the nineteenth century, with a square shape measuring only about 70×70 mm., and contained twenty-six hand-coloured lithographic maps, often with keys:

Eastern Hemisphere; Western Hemisphere; Europe; Portugal & Spain; France; Italy; Britain; Sweden & Norway; Denmark; Germany; North-west Germany & Netherlands; North-east Germany; South-west Germany & Switzerland; South-east Germany; Prussia & Poland; Turkey in Europe; Asia; Africa; North America; South America; Australia; European Russia; East Indies; West Indies; United States of America; Egypt.
