

The Edinburgh publisher Alex. Macredie published two really charming series of miniature maps by William Murphy and both of them were undated. The first was a miniature world atlas (see 1825a) and the other was an even rarer county atlas of Scotland. At 150 x 125 mm., this was more than twice the size of the world one and the National Library of Scotland dates it to about 1832.

It consists of thirty-seven plates, the first three being the title-page, contents page and plan of hills. The following thirty-four maps are numbered 4 to 37. The first is a small folding one of Scotland and the rest are single-page ones of the Scottish counties, about 90 x 125 mm. with the titles in raised borders. All were drawn, engraved and signed by Murphy, whose prolific output included further miniature series by other publishers (see 1832b, 1832e, 1835 &1850a), and they have very attractive full hand-colour:
