


William Murphy's second series of miniature thematic maps appeared in Bible atlases: the first a small one, 180 mm. high and the second was a miniature one, about 140 x 110 mm. In this latter work an undated engraved title-page with a view of Bethlehem is followed by a contents list and a preface, which is dated 24th June 1840. A four page introduction precedes the atlas in which the maps are on the verso, followed by a leaf of descriptive text. The set consists of twenty-four numbered and signed maps with hand-colour, about 90 x 120/3 mm. and all nicely done:
