



An anonymous set of nine cards with gilt edges was probably issued in London, perhaps a year or two prior to the 1841 census, as the population figures given for Liverpool and London would suggest. They are hand-coloured lithographs, 72 x 100 mm. in size, with maps on the upper half of one side and views of cities on the upper half of the other side. The lower half of both sides features topographical tables, all apparently without any logical sequence.

The cards are housed in a black morocco slip-case with gilt decoration, which measures 105×80 mm. and seems to be contemporary. The maps are on scrolls with their titles at the foot:

Europe; Asia; Africa; North America; South America; New-Holland; Kingdoms in Europe; Great Britain; Spain & Portugal.
